



Calling all young artists! Join the Gibbes Museum of Art for a great summer of creative fun at our 2009 Summer Art Camp. Work with practicing artists and museum teachers, explore the museum's galleries for inspiration and create your own fantastic artwork! This summer, artists can choose from three themes: **Seeing Our City**, **Picture Yourself** and **Printmaking**. Classes will be held across from the museum at the Circular Congregational Church in their 'green' classrooms. Campers will meet at the Gibbes each morning.

Camp sessions run from 9:00am - 12:00pm. Snacks will be provided.

Tuition includes art supplies, take-home art projects, snacks, hands-on workshops and museum tours. Exhibitions on view at the Gibbes this summer include *The Charleston Story*, *Printmaking*, *Prop Master: An Installation by Juan Logan and Susan Harbage Page* and *Jeff Whetstone: Post-Pleistocene*. ## Seeing Our City

Just as artists do, students will work "en plein air," exploring some of Charleston's beautiful gardens, parks and architecture. Campers will learn to draw what they see and later transform those drawings into finished works of art. Basic drawing, color theory and an introduction to painting techniques will accompany other art media this week. Students will spend time with the Gibbes' permanent collection studying works of art that reflect different artists' views of the city.

Creating a self-portrait is fun and empowering during this week long look at portraiture throughout the ages. Students will learn about different movements in Art History while exploring this theme. Students will explore the many portraits in the Gibbes' collection in addition to encountering Picasso, Matisse, Kahlo, Klee and more.
